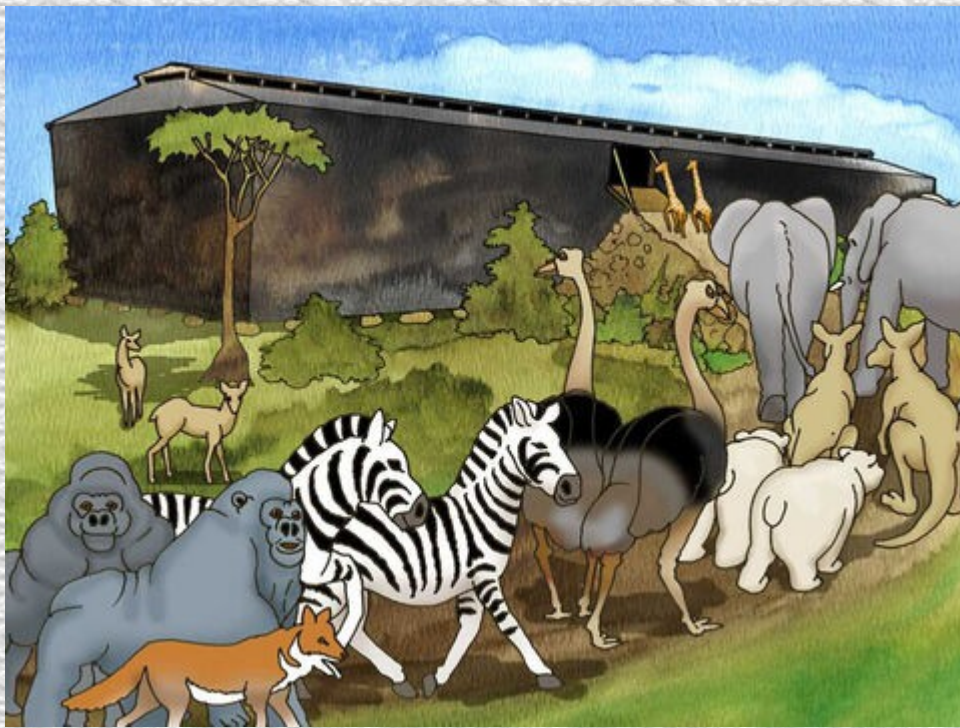

Can you believe what Jonah was doing during this terrible storm? He was sleeping. Imagine that! The scared captain shook him awake and told him to pray. The captain and

sailors were religious but they didn't know the one, true God. They found out from Jonah that Yahweh, the true Creator God, had sent the storm to stop Jonah running away. Jonah knew it was no use trying to fight God. He gave up. He knew his disobedience had brought this trouble on the men of the ship. So he said: "Pick me up and throw me into the sea; then the sea will become calm for you." (Jonah 1:12, NKJV.)

The men didn't want to throw Jonah overboard even though he had caused this problem for them. They tried to row against the storm. But it was hopeless. The angry storm got even worse. So, they gave up fighting against the storm sent by God. They cried out to Yahweh God and asked Him to forgive them for throwing Jonah into the sea. As Jonah splashed into the waves, so the sea calmed down. The sailors were very afraid and made an offering to the one, true God, Yahweh. They were grateful that He had saved their lives. How would you have felt, dear Reader?

But what happened to Jonah? Jonah told about his experience in the scroll that he wrote. We call it the Book of Jonah. It is in the Old Testament, in the Bible.

This is what Jonah said happened to him:

"All your billows and your waves passed over me....Weeds were wrapped around my head. I went down to the moorings of the mountains...." (Jonah 2:3,5-6. NKJV.)

It seems that Jonah thought that his time had come! That was it; he was going to drown. God was finished with Him. But he did a very wise thing; he prayed to Yahweh.

Yahweh is the one, true God, full of love and grace. He will punish sin but He will also help us when we cry to Him. Please remember this, dear Reader. God had already made a very special huge fish to rescue Jonah! This amazing fish came along and swallowed Jonah. Inside the fish's belly, for three days and three nights, Jonah stayed.

It was a sort of fishy prison! I think it must have been smelly and disgusting to Jonah. But it was a good time for Jonah to think and pray. Jonah began to thank the Lord for saving him from drowning.

When God heard Jonah's prayer, and knew that His prophet was sorry he had tried to run away, He 'spoke to the fish and it vomited Jonah onto dry land.' (Jonah 2:10.) Then Yahweh God told Jonah a second time to go and warn the people of Nineveh. This time Jonah obeyed God. I think I would have too!

Now, before, I end this true story, I must tell you that there are people who say this story is just a fairy tale. But, the Lord Jesus Christ Himself talked about Jonah in the fish's belly as something that really happened. You can read what He said in Matthew 12:39-41. Also, Yahweh God created the whole universe out of nothing. You can read about the creation in Genesis 1. So why could Yahweh not have created a special fish to do a special job at a special time? Of course, He did.

Psalm 148

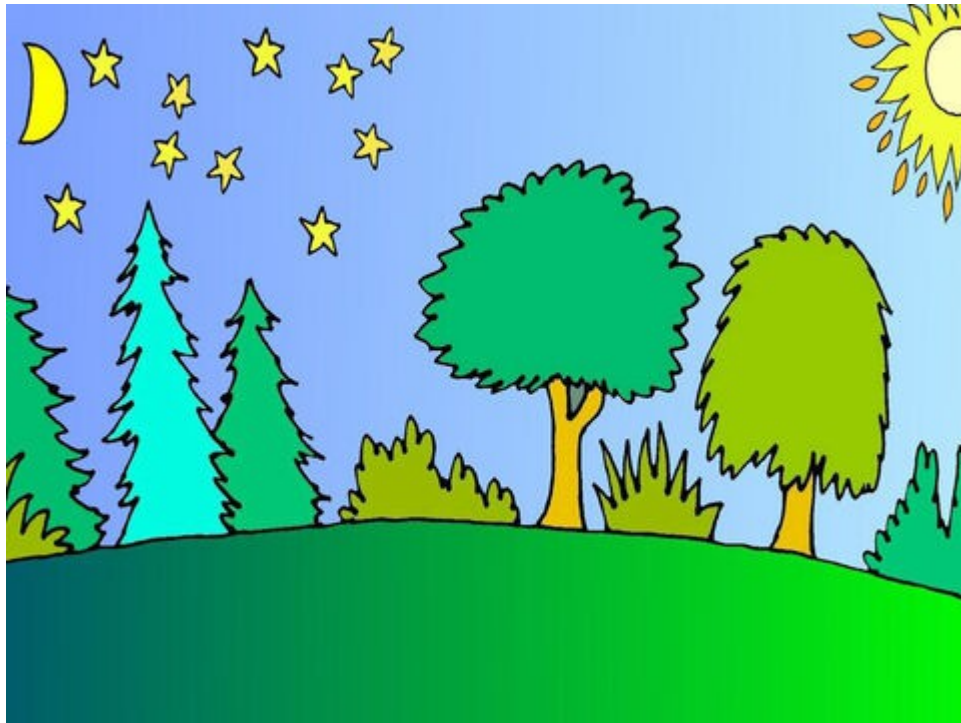
Praise The Name Of The Lord!

3 Praise him, sun and moon, praise him, all you shining stars!



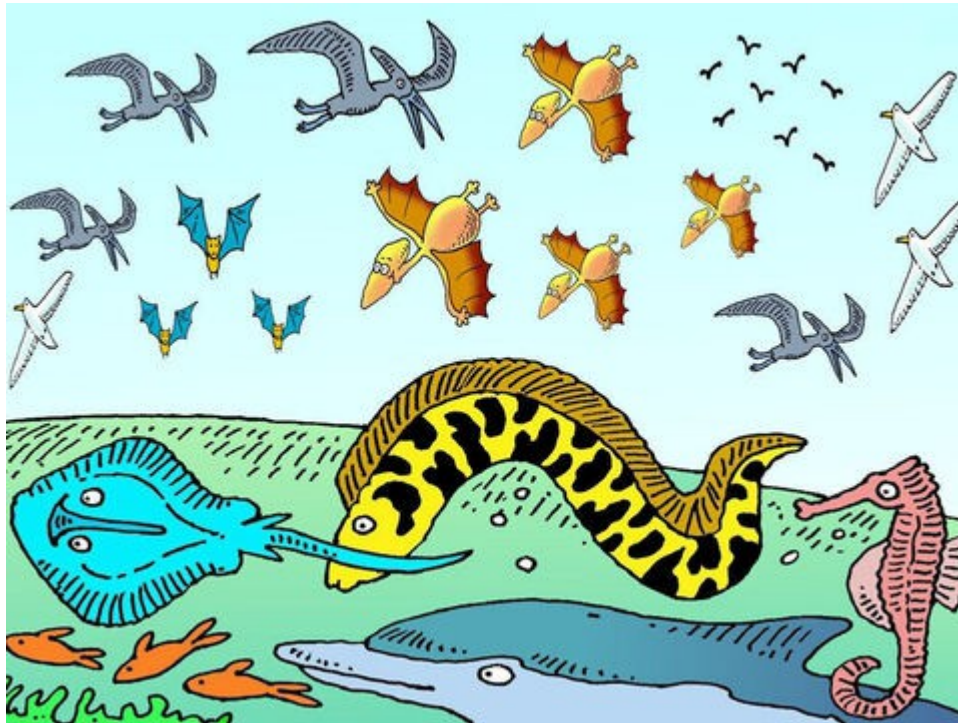

Go Fish! Card Game

Time for a game! I hope you will enjoy playing this. These links give instructions:

GAME INSTRUCTIONS

The aim of the game is to match as many cards as you can. For example, 2 Queens, 2 Aces, 2 Sevens and so on. For 2 or more players.

Shuffle a deck of playing cards. Deal 5 cards to each player.

Players with pairs of matching cards put them down, face up, before the game begins. The other cards are held in their hands so that the other players cannot see them.

Decide who will go first. For example, the player with the biggest shoes, the person who has a rabbit as a pet, or whose birthday comes last, etc. Have fun choosing! Each player gets a turn, going clockwise after the first player.

Each player gets a turn to ask any one of the other players whether he or she has a particular card that player needs to make a pair.

For example: David: "Harley, do you have a Five?" If Harley has a five, then she must give it to David. David then puts down his pair of fives. He then asks for other cards he needs to make matching pairs from the cards in his hand.

For example: David: "Danielle, do you have a King?" If Danielle has a King, David puts down the pair of Kings. But, if Danielle does not have a King, she says: "Go fish!" David picks up the top card from the "pool" (the deck). If this card is a King, then David puts down the Kings and continues asking the players, one at a time, for cards he needs to match his cards. If the card he "fishes" out of the "pool" is not a King, his turn ends and the next player gets a turn.

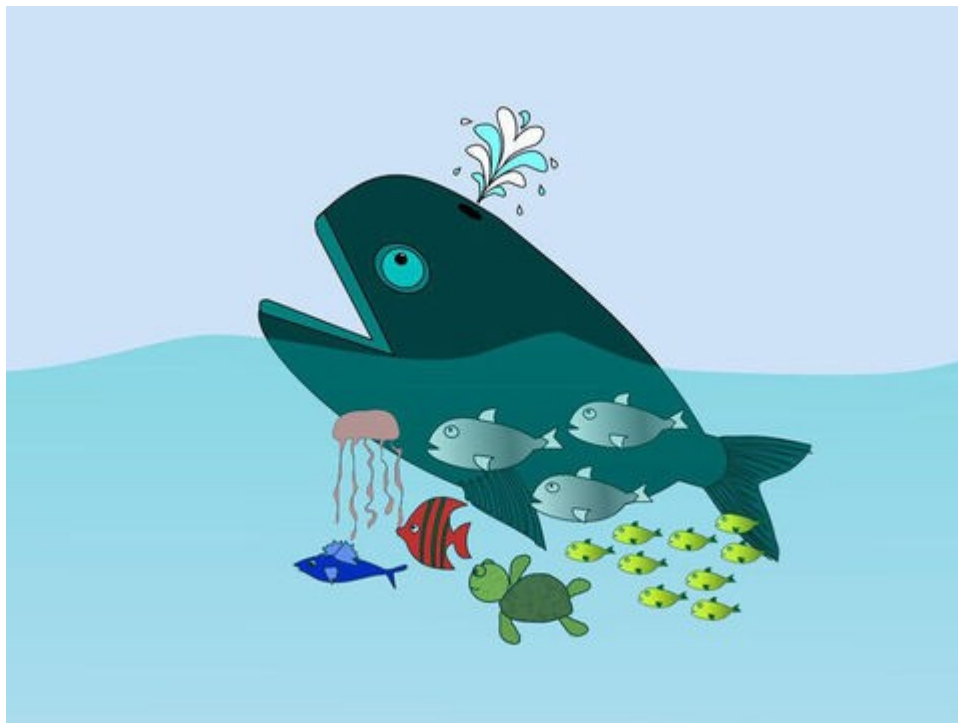
The game ends when the "pool" is empty. If a player uses up all his cards, but the "pool" is not empty, then he must draw 5 more cards and continue playing.

The winner is the player with the most pairs of matching cards.

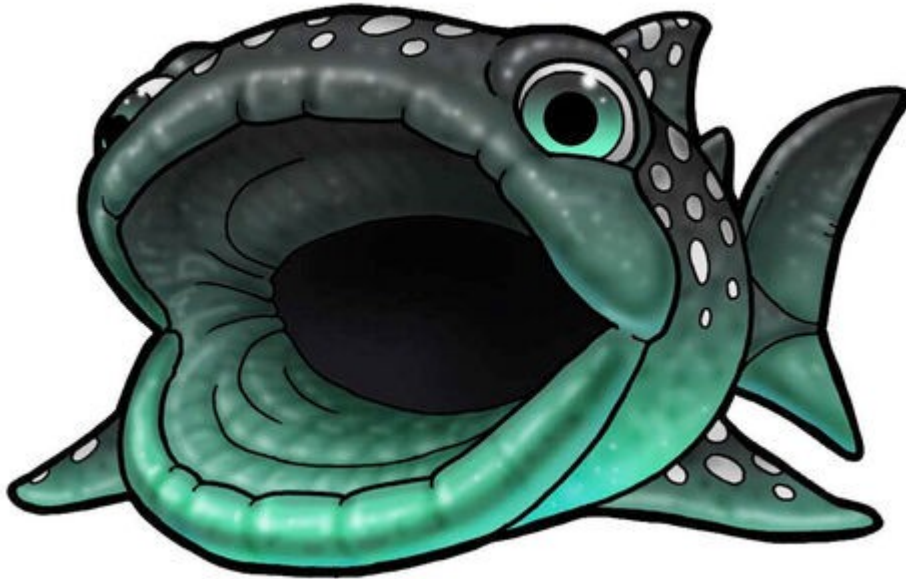

Fishy Craft Ideas

I think you'll have fun making these pretty fish, dear Reader.

THINGS YOU NEED:

Paper plates or cardboard cut into a round shape, or old CD's or DVD's
Pieces of coloured paper or gift wrap
Glue and/or a stapler
Decorations such as beads, buttons, glitter, sequins, bits of paper or foil, etc.
Thick pens or crayons
String or strong ribbon

TO MAKE:

Draw or make and stick one big fishy eye on to your plate or CD or DVD or cardboard shape. You could use a big button or bead.
Draw and cut out two sets of fins from the coloured paper and stick them on to the fish shape.
Now make two big fishy lips and stick them on to your fish. Draw a smiley mouth next to the lips.
Draw a big semi-circle behind the eye and mouth to separate the face from the body.
Draw lots of semi-circles on the body to make scales.
Use your decorations to make your fish look beautiful.
Attach the string to the top of the fish and hang it in a breezy spot where it can "swim."

Now sit back and enjoy it!

The Funny But Frustrating Plague Of FROGS!

When Yahweh God rescued the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt, He used ten plagues. One of these was the plague of frogs. I really like frogs, dear Reader. I'm not sure why. But not so many all at one time. Trying not to stand or sit on them - ugh!

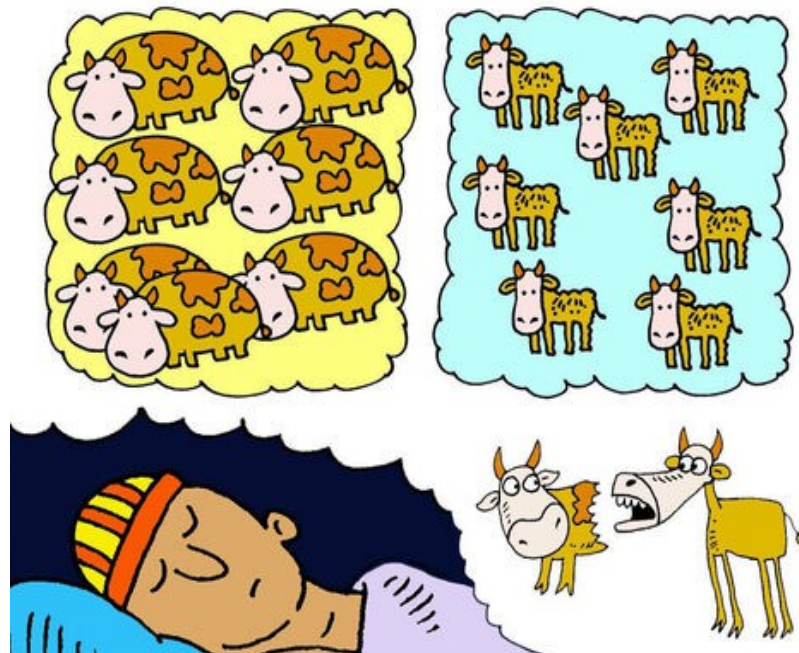
A plague is something annoying. It can also be something that hurts, like the plague of locusts that ate up all the food. The plague of frogs was actually quite funny - as long as you weren't in Egypt at the time!

This was the situation: the people of Israel had been living as slaves to the Egyptians for a very long time. The king of Egypt, who was called the Pharaoh, used them badly. He made them sweat from dawn to dusk, without pay, doing hard, hard work. He treated them like prisoners. He bent their backs under heavy burdens. They made bricks for his building projects. Bricks, bricks and more bricks. Day in and day out. No holidays. No weekends. Work or be whipped! And I thought being a teacher was hard work!

Not only did the Pharaoh make the children of Israel his slaves, he also made it a law to murder the Hebrew boy babies as soon as they were born. Fortunately, God had two brave women who saved many of these babies from the cruel Pharaoh. So the Hebrews, who were also called Israelites, cried out to the God of their fathers; the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. God had given Jacob the name, Israel, so Jacob's children and their children and their children were all called the children of Israel or Israelites.

Jacob had twelve sons. These brothers had children. Their children had children. And so on. Over time they became a large group of people. In fact, my father, whose name was also Abraham, was descended from the great- great- great- great- great- great- great- great- great- great- great-grandchildren of Israel! There should be more "greats" there! So in a way, this is part of my family's history, dear Reader. Today the children of Israel who live in the land of Israel call themselves Israelis. Those living outside the land of Israel call themselves Jews.

But back to our story. The children of Israel had gone to Egypt hundreds of years earlier during a bad famine. A famine is a very bad food shortage. It is sometimes caused by lack of rain to water the crops that people grow for food. Israel's son Joseph had been used by God to rescue the Egyptians from the famine. God had given the Pharaoh of that time special dreams warning him that a bad famine was coming.

Then God had told Joseph what the dreams meant. God had also given Joseph wisdom to

know what to do to help the people of Egypt. And Joseph told all this to the Pharaoh. So the Pharaoh of that earlier time had made Joseph second in command under him. He trusted and honoured Joseph because God used Joseph to save the Egyptians from starving to death.

Joseph helped the Egyptians to save and store their grain to eat during the famine. Not only that, but Joseph sold some of the grain to the starving people from the lands near Egypt, including his own family. So Pharaoh had been happy to have Joseph's family come to live in Egypt and gave them the beautiful land of Goshen to settle in.

That was a very long time ago. Now this new Pharaoh hated the Israelites and forced them to work as slaves. But God heard the desperate prayers of the children of Israel. And God had a plan to rescue them from their trouble. So God raised up an Israelite called Moses to lead God's people. God's plan was to take the Israelites out of Egypt, away from slavery and into the land He had promised to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

Moses and his brother, Aaron, went to Pharaoh just as God told them to. They told Pharaoh that he must send the children of Israel out of Egypt. But Pharaoh didn't like to be told what to do. He didn't know the one true God, Yahweh. In fact, Pharaoh thought that he himself was a god. So Pharaoh ignored Moses and Aaron, even after God

had made Aaron's rod turn into a snake. Even after God sent the first plague to show Pharaoh that He was the true God, Pharaoh went on hardening his heart against God.

So God sent Moses and Aaron back to tell Pharaoh: "Thus says the LORD: Let My people go, that they may serve Me." They warned Pharaoh that if he disobeyed God again, God would send a plague of frogs. God promised that if Pharaoh disobeyed Him, many, many frogs would come up from the Nile River. Can you imagine the noise they would make, dear Reader? Kwaak! Kwaak!

God warned that those frogs would hop into Pharaoh's house. And they would hop into Pharaoh's bedroom. Then they would hop on to Pharaoh's bed. His nice clean bed! And those pesky frogs would hop into Pharaoh's servants' houses. They would even hop into the ovens. And into the bowls used to make bread. Plop! Plop! Kwaak! Kwaak! Kwaak! And God warned Pharaoh that those pesky, pestiferous frogs would come up on him and on his people and on all his servants. Can you imagine how horrible that would be, dear Reader? Lots and lots of slimy, slippery, jumping, leaping, croaking frogs. Ugh!

Because God is gracious and patient and prefers to bless rather than to punish people, God told Pharaoh how horrible this plague would be, before He brought the plague. So God was giving Pharaoh a chance to change his mind, to believe God, and to let the

Israelites go.

For seven days the water of the river was blood! That must have been frightening and disgusting. But no. Just like a naughty, spoiled teenager, this Pharaoh refused to listen to God. He hardened his heart against God. Maybe he was jealous of the real God who was more powerful than he was?

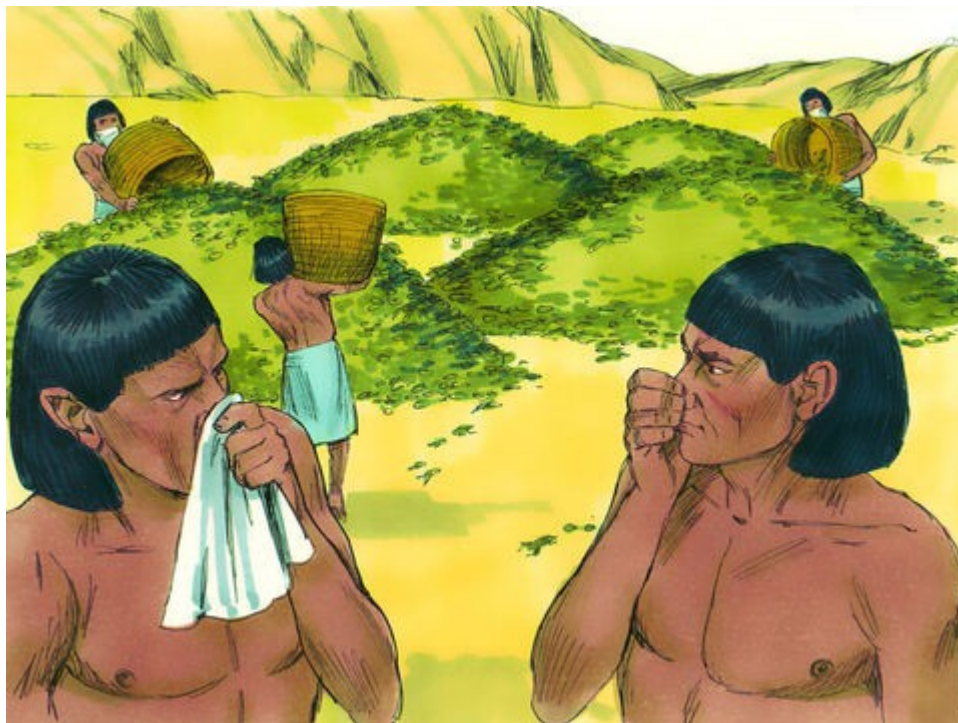
So, God said to Moses to tell Aaron to hold the rod over the streams and over the rivers and over the ponds. Then the frogs would come up from the streams and the rivers and the ponds. And they would cover the land of Egypt. That is exactly what happened. When God says something will happen, you know it will happen. God never lies.

Now, Pharaoh's magicians were trying hard to make Pharaoh look as powerful as God. So guess what they did? They used their spells to make more frogs! You would think they would at least try to get rid of the frogs. But they just made more frogs. I wonder what Pharaoh thought of that?

Anyway, finally even Pharaoh had had enough of the frogs. So he called for Moses. He

actually asked Moses politely to beg God to take away the frogs. And he promised that then he would let God's people go away to worship Him.

Now, you might think that God would make the frogs hop right back to the streams and the rivers and the ponds. But instead God made the frogs die where they were. They died in the houses, the courtyards and the fields. Then the people piled up the dead frogs in heaps. The Bible tells us that the whole land stank because of the dead frogs. How disgusting! I think that that was part of the punishment of the plague. Doing bad things, like disobeying God, or disobeying parents, always ends badly. Disobeying God made the whole land of Egypt stink.

Pharaoh now decided to let his Israelite slaves go, right? Wrong! Although he was glad that the plague of frogs had stopped, he hardened his heart again. Apparently, he wasn't going to be told what to do by anyone. Not even the one, true God.

But Yahweh is very patient. He is much more patient with us than we are with each other. I am so glad God is patient with me, dear Reader. So God sent more plagues, one after the other. Up until the seventh plague, God gave Pharaoh a chance to change his mind and obey. But after the seventh plague God punished Pharaoh by hardening

Pharaoh's heart Himself. The tenth and last plague hurt Pharaoh and his people so badly that Pharaoh finally gave in. In fact he and his people wanted the Israelites to leave so God would stop punishing them. It really doesn't help us to be stubborn because we just hurt ourselves.

Here's an interesting fact: the ancient Egyptians actually worshiped a false goddess in the form of a frog. They called it Heqet. But this false goddess couldn't save them from the power of Yahweh, the one, true living God. And the Pharaoh, who believed he was a god, was completely defeated by Yahweh.

You can read about the plague of frogs and the whole true account of God's rescue operation in the first fifteen chapters in the book of Exodus. That's the second book of the Bible. Exodus means a "going out from" of many people. It is how the Israelites were taken out from Egypt and slavery under the cruel Pharaoh. The rest of the book of Exodus tells us how God protected, looked after and disciplined the children of Israel. He made them into His own special nation. It is an amazing true story, dear Reader. One day you will be able to read it on your own.

What You Will Need To Make This Easy Paper Plate And Handprint Frog:

A paper plate

Stiff paper or cardboard

Pencil and rubber

Crayons or paint

Black permanent marker or thick felt tipped black pen

A pair of scissors

Glue

How To Make This Funny Frog:

Colour or paint the paper plate green. This is the frog's body.

Draw around your hands. Colour or paint them green.

Draw two circles from white paper or cardboard for eyes.

Make a big, black dot at the bottom of each eye.

Make a mouth shape and colour it black.

Draw a long, straight tongue and colour it red. Or, use a red paper ribbon to make the tongue.

Carefully cut out the hand prints for the frog's feet.

Carefully cut out the eye circles.

Carefully cut out the mouth shape.

Carefully cut out the tongue strip and curl it around and around a pen to make it curly. Or curl the ribbon with the pair of scissors.

Stick the feet to the bottom of the paper plate.

Stick the eyes to the top of the paper plate.

Draw two little round nostrils below the eyes.

Stick the mouth below the nostrils.

Stick the tongue to the mouth.

Put it in a safe spot to dry.

Enjoy it!

To gather every day.



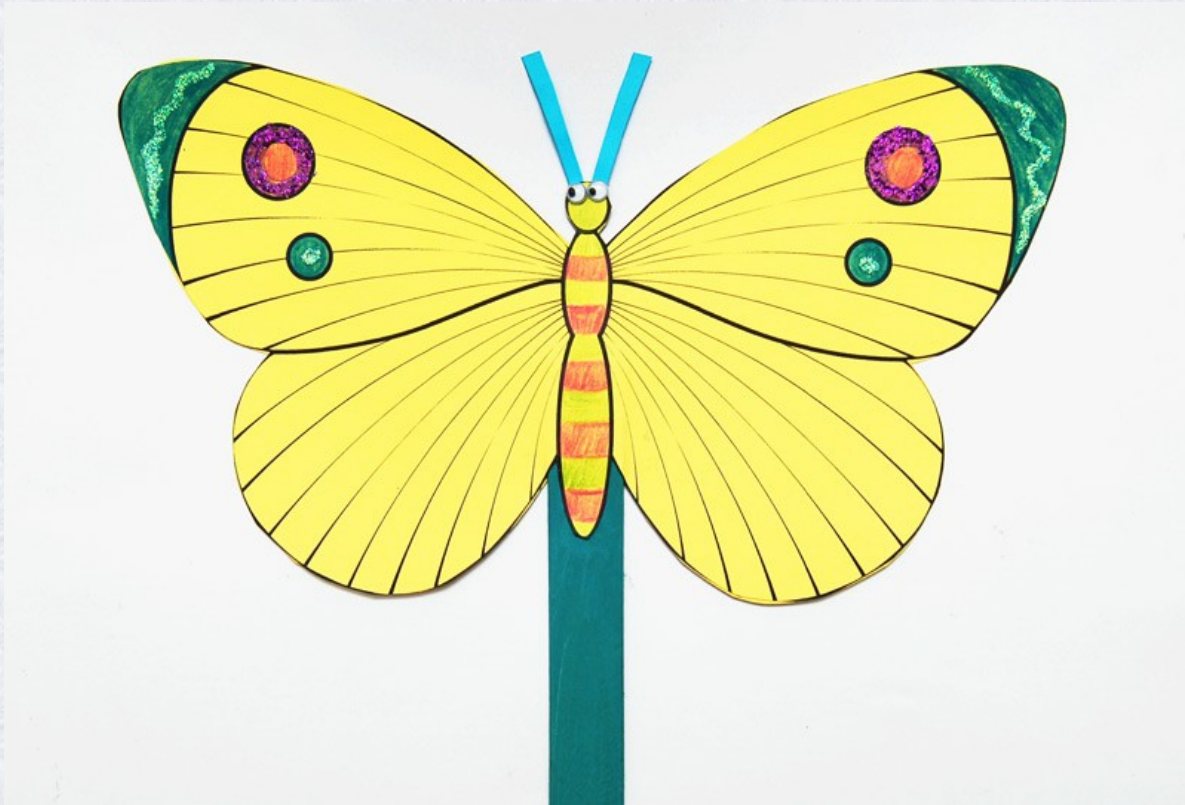

What You Will Need:

Cardboard - white or a pale colour

Crayons / paints

Pencil and rubber

Felt tipped pens

A pair of scissors - please be careful!

Little thin cardboard strips or drinking straws for the antennae

Bits and pieces to decorate: glitter/beads /buttons/shiny paper/sequins....

Glue stick

Strong glue for the handle and antennae

A very strong strip of cardboard, or a flat stick or a ruler for the handle or something similar

How To Make It:

First draw a large, simple butterfly shape. You can copy the picture if you want. It must be big enough to make a breeze when you fan yourself.

Carefully cut out your butterfly.

Then draw the body and the eyes. Do this on both sides of your butterfly.

Colour the butterfly with your crayons or paint, if you want to. Leave the body strip blank. The handle will go here. You could also draw, colour and cut out the body to stick on after you have attached the handle.

Carefully cut out two thin strips of cardboard for the antennae. Or you could use drinking straws.

Stick on the antennae.

Attach the handle. If your handle is made of thick cardboard, you will need two strips, one on each side of the butterfly to hold it firmly. **Let it dry.**

Now decorate the wings of your butterfly. Remember to decorate both sides.

Wait for the decorations to dry before using your fan.

How To Make A Butterfly Mask:

Use similar steps as for the fan.

But:

Draw two holes for your eyes in the wings. Ask Mommy or Daddy to help you measure where to place the eye holes.

You can read about this exciting time in Matthew chapter 21:1-17, Mark chapter 11:1-10, Luke chapter 19:28-40 and John chapter 12:12-18. How wonderful it was! The prophet Zechariah also wrote about this hundreds of years before it happened. His prophecy is in chapter 9:9 of Zechariah. This is what he wrote:

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion!
Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem!
Behold your King is coming to you;
He is just and having salvation,
Lowly and riding on a donkey,
A colt, the foal of a donkey.

But they didn't understand that their King, Jesus the Christ, Y'shua the Messiah, was coming as a humble servant-king, the first time. The second time He will come on a white horse. Then He will rule over the nation of Israel and the whole world. But that is in the future. You can read about that in Revelation chapter 19:11-16.

The first time that Jesus Christ came was to die for us. He came as God in a human body - but without any bad thoughts, or bad words, or bad wishes or bad actions. He was - and is - completely good. He is the one and only, very special God-man.

All human beings, dear Reader, you and me, our family, our friends and all the people who have ever lived on earth, sometimes think bad thoughts, speak bad words, want bad things and do bad things. We can't help it. We were born that way. The Bible calls this sin. We sin because we are all sinners. We are born with a sin nature. Even the things we do that we think are good, are actually sinful in God's eyes because God knows our thoughts. God knows that we are selfish deep down in our hearts. We are not like Him.

You see, God is one hundred percent good. He alone is perfect, just, true, very, very patient, kind and caring. He loves us, bad as we are, with a beautiful, unselfish love. He does not want anything from us in return. He just pours out His love on us.

But there is a very big problem. The Bible tells us that God the Father cannot live with sinners. Our sin separates us from God. Not only can God not live with sinners, but because God is just and fair, He has to punish sinners. Even sinful people want justice. We want people who hurt other people to be punished. That is because God made us in His image. Even very small children are taught by good parents not to scream and shout and throw things when they get angry. Their parents have to teach them to share their toys with other children. Good parents have to punish their children when they behave badly.

Now, the problem is that we human beings cannot stop sinning. If we count up all the selfish thoughts any one person has during their lives, by the time they are old, that would be thousands and thousands of bad, selfish thoughts. God in the Bible tells us what these selfish thoughts are: wanting what someone else has, is one. Another kind of selfish thought is holding on to angry thoughts about someone. Or not wanting to share what you have with other people even when they need help. Or thinking that you are better than other people. We all have these sinful thoughts. It is because of our sin nature. Unfortunately, those selfish, hurtful thoughts lead to selfish, hurtful words and selfish, hurtful behaviour.

However, God still loves us. The Bible tells us that God made everything. That means He made you and me. He knows all about us. He knows our thoughts. He knows when we cry and are sad. He wants us to trust Him and get to know Him. He wants us to talk to Him about everything. And most of all He wants to save us from the punishment that He has

to give us because of all our sins. And at the same time He wants to set us free from being controlled by our sin nature. He wants us to live really happy, peaceful lives.

So God the Father gave God the Son to us all. He gave His wonderful, one and only Son to take the punishment we all deserve. Jesus Christ, God the Son, the only God-man, died on the cross for us all. He took all of our sins in His body on the cross. He died for me. He died for you. He died for every human being who ever lived or who ever will live. He died to take the punishment that we all deserve for all our sins.

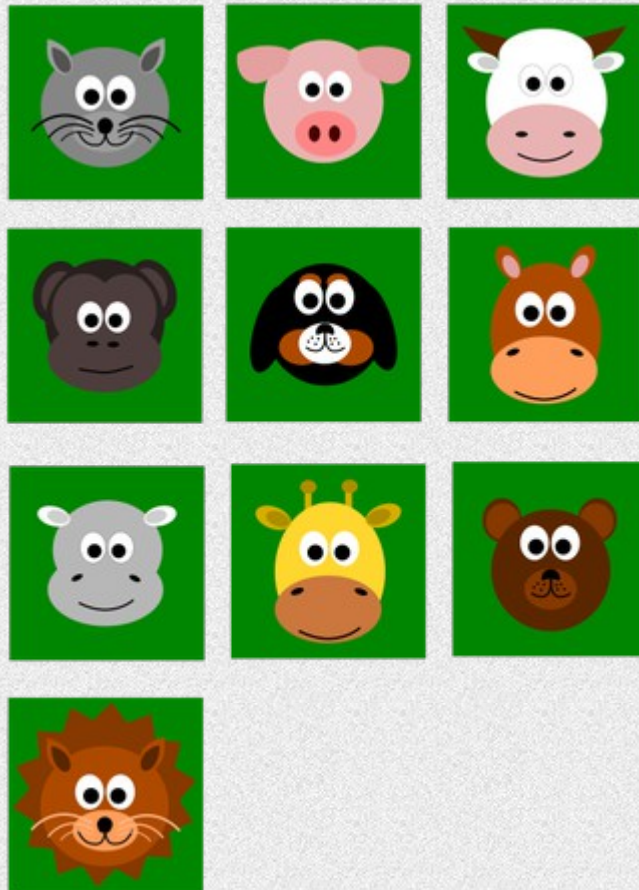

THINGS YOU WILL NEED:

Blank paper or thin cardboard
Ruler
Pencil and rubber
Thick coloured pens
Crayons or paints

HOW TO DRAW YOUR ANIMALS:

1. Using your ruler and pencil, divide a sheet of the blank paper or cardboard into blocks. Make them wide enough for your animals.
2. Carefully draw a circle in each block, using your pencil.
3. When you are happy with the pencil circles, ink them in with your thick coloured pens.
4. Have a look at the picture above to see how different animals can be made from the circles. What animals can you see?
5. Decide which animals you want to draw. You could make different animals from the ones in the picture. For example, you could draw a mouse with two big round ears, whiskers and a sharp, pointed nose.
6. Take your pencil and *lightly* draw ears, whiskers, eyes, mouth, nose, etc. for each animal at a time.
7. When you are happy with each animal use your thick pens to ink in the ears, etc.
8. Now repeat these steps until all your circles have been made into animals.
9. Then use your crayons or paints to colour them in.
10. Let them dry.

Make Your Own Birthday Cards

You can cut out rectangles of blank cardboard and fold them in half.



Stick an animal picture on the part of the card facing up.
Write your birthday message inside the card.

Daniel in the Den of Lions

This is one of my favourite true stories in the Bible, dear Reader. It helps me to remember that God loves me and that He is more powerful than people who hurt me. Even when I go through hard times, God is still there, watching over me. The Bible tells us that God works all things, even bad things, together for good for those who love Him. That is in Romans 8:28.

Daniel was a Jewish man, an Israelite, who lived in the land of Babylon. He was dragged off to Babylon with many other Jews, when the very powerful Babylonian king destroyed Jerusalem and stole all the treasures from God's temple. God used this to discipline the Israelites living at that time, because the nation as a whole were very disobedient. They had turned their back on God and worshiped idols. They did many horrible things. This went on for many, many years. Finally, after warning them over and over, God had to stop them and discipline them.

Daniel was a teenager when he was taken captive with the other Jews and made to live in Babylon. He loved God with all his heart and God blessed him greatly with wisdom. Like Joseph, God told him the meanings of dreams and visions that God gave to the Babylonian kings. He served many different kings in Babylon and was greatly respected and honoured by them.

Now Daniel used to pray in his room, with his windows open, facing Jerusalem. He did this three times a day. He did this out of love for God. He did it because he needed God. He did it because he knew God was the one true, all powerful Creator. And he did it because he worshiped God.

Even when Daniel was an old man he still worked for the kings who ruled over Babylon. Now the Medes and Persians had defeated the Babylonian king and taken over their kingdom. The king ruling at that time was Darius the Mede.

Darius divided up his huge kingdom under one hundred and twenty rulers. Then Darius put three governors over the hundred and twenty rulers. Daniel was one of these top rulers. Because he was so good, Darius was going to make him the ruler over the whole kingdom, under himself.

Now the other rulers and governors were envious of Daniel. Do you remember that I explained to you that bad thoughts lead to bad actions, dear Reader? Well, here is an example. Instead of being glad that King Darius had picked them to rule under him, these bad men hated Daniel. They wanted the honour that Darius was giving Daniel. So they plotted against Daniel to get rid of him.

One day these bad men crowded into the king's palace and went to see the king. They tricked King Darius into making it a crime for anyone to pray to any god or man except Darius himself for thirty days. Darius was flattered! He enjoyed being treated like a god. He fell into the sin of pride, thinking too much of himself.

So Darius signed a new law that stated that anyone praying to any god or man apart from himself, would be thrown into the den of lions. Now, the law of the Medes and Persians could not be changed once it had been signed by the king. Those envious rulers must have been rubbing their hands together with glee. They knew that Daniel truly loved the Yahweh His God and would go on praying to Him.

And that's what Daniel did. He thanked God for His blessings and he asked God for things as well. I am sure he must have asked God to protect him from these bad men. Daniel would have known he would be thrown into the lions' den. But he chose to trust God rather than men. Maybe he also asked Yahweh God to help him be brave and strong. Perhaps he asked God to help him to keep on trusting and worshiping Him only.

It was easy for the men who hated Daniel to report him to the king. When they did, Darius knew he himself was to blame for signing such a law. All day King Darius tried to come up with a plan to rescue Daniel, his most trusted ruler. At last the day ended and the group of envious rulers went back to the king. Boldly, they made him carry out the bad law that they had tricked him into signing.

So Daniel was brought before Darius like a criminal. We know Daniel had done nothing wrong. All he had done was to worship and pray to the one, true, living God, the God of Abraham, the father of the Jews. And Darius obeyed his own law and had Daniel thrown into the den of lions. But before they shut him up in the den, Darius told Daniel that he believed Daniel's God would rescue him.

Then a heavy stone was laid on the opening of the den. The king had to seal it shut with his ring and the rings of the lords of the kingdom. Now no one dared open the den to rescue Daniel! Can you imagine how sad Darius must have felt and how angry he must have been with himself? He would eat no food and he could not sleep either. It was a night of fear and sorrow for King Darius.

So early in the morning the king rushed off to the lions' den. "Daniel, servant of the living God," he shouted. "Daniel has your God been able to save you from the lions?" His heart must have been thumping as he waited to hear Dear Reader, can you imagine how King Darius must have felt?

Then came this amazing reply from Daniel: "O king, live forever! My God sent His angel and shut the lions' mouths."

Here are all the materials you'll need:

Cardboard toilet paper tube rolls

Cotton wool balls

Black card

Pink metallic marker

Googly eyes, small

Scissors

Glue

Instructions:

1. Begin by applying glue around a cardboard toilet roll tube.
2. Stick cotton wool balls all around the cardboard roll.

3. Now cut out an oval shape from black card for the face.
4. You will also need to cut out 4 paw shapes and 2 small ear shapes, as shown.
5. Glue the ears to the back of the oval, to the side.
6. Stick on two googly eyes and draw a simple nose with the pink metallic marker.
7. Glue the head to the top of the cardboard roll.
8. Separate the cotton wool balls along the side and glue in the paws.

Some Last Thoughts About Animals

God has given us the animals to care for, to enjoy, to use for food and clothing, for work and for protection. Some animals are too wild for us humans to live with in this age, like lions, bears and snakes. But a time is coming when the Lord Jesus Christ will rule as King over the earth from Jerusalem. Then there will be a wonderful time when animals that are dangerous today will not be harmful then.

This is what the prophet Isaiah writes about that coming, wonderful time in chapter 11:6-9:

The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them. The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the adder's den.
